

Keukenhof is a very large flower garden in the Netherlands. There are more than 7 million flowers of all kinds at the Keukenhof Gardens. It's called the Garden of Europe. You can visit it in the spring, from the end of March to the end of May. There is a 15 km walking path all around the gardens. You can also take a 45-minute boat ride and see the beautiful gardens from the river. The Gardens of Versailles in France are very lovely and interesting. Here you can see more than 200,000 trees, different kinds of plants and 372 statues. There's also a beautiful castle that you can visit. About 6 million people go to the Gardens of Versailles every year.

The Kew Gardens near London are 250 years old! They're very big gardens with all kinds of plants, trees and flowers.

There's a nice lake at Kew Gardens, too. Kew Gardens are part of the UNESCO World Heritage. You can visit the gardens on foot or you can take a small train all around the gardens. Claude Monet's gardens in Giverny, France, are famous all over the world. There are a lot of beautiful paintings of the Giverny Gardens in important art museums.

The Desert Botanical Garden in Phoenix, Arizona, USA, is a very unusual garden. There are no flowers here! Only desert plants grow in this garden. You can visit it any time of the year — it's always hot and sunny!
