In the year 43 CE the Roman Emperor Claudius sent an army of 40,000 soldiers to invade Britain. The Romans founded the town of Londinium on the north side of the River Thames. The Roman soldiers built a wooden bridge across the River Thames and Londinium became a busy center for trade.

Queen Boudicca attacked and destroyed Londinium in the year 60 CD, but the Romans rebuilt it and it became the capital of Britannia.

By the year 100 CE Londinium had a population of about 65,000 people. The Romans built beautiful homes, important public buildings, theaters and big roads.

Between the years 190 and 225 CE the Romans built a tall wall of about three kilometers around the northern part of Londinium to protect it.

Today you can see parts of the old Roman wall at the Museum of London. At the museum you can also see beautiful Roman works of art and other interesting objects.

In the year 407 the city of Rome was having problems with invaders. Emperor Constantine III called the Roman army back to Rome to protect it. This was the end of the Roman rule.
